Directions To Holiday Party At The Kirkwood's

If you are coming from the **Beltway**, take **7, Leesburg Pike** towards Leesburg, about **11** miles. **Turn Right** on **Georgetown Pike** and make an **immediate Left** on **Seneca Rd**. (There is a **Sunoco** Gas station at the corner of 7 and Georgetown Pike.)

Stay on Seneca about **two miles**. (Be sure to stay Right at Kentland and Seneca.) **Turn Right** on **Seneca Knoll Dr.** (Just to keep it confusing, there are several streets with Seneca before Seneca Knoll...Seneca View Way and Seneca Farm Way. **Seneca Knoll is the next street after Seneca Farm Way.** There is a right turn lane as a cue.) We are on the **third house on the right**. There are two driveways and you are welcome to park in either one. Unfortunately, they are only one car wide and folks will need to move cars if you plan to leave early. Otherwise park on the street.

If you are coming from the Fairfax County Parkway, exit going East on Route 7, Leesburg Pike. Drive about 1.5 miles. You will see the Sunoco Station on the left. Turn Left on Georgetown Pike and an immediate Left on Seneca Rd. Continue as in the paragraph "Stay on Seneca ..." above.
