But then, the late fall, winter and early spring are quiet times for everyone, shade and sun gardeners, alike. However, as you know there are still options for those periods. Our fall speaker, landscape designer **George McLellan**, will provide these options for "The Garden in Winter".

An expert in native azaleas, he chaired the Species Study Group of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter of the American Rhododendron Society which led the way for rescuing and reestablishing native azalea populations on Gregory Bald and other locations in the Blue Ridge and Smoky Mountains of North Carolina. He is a recipient of the Silver Medal from the American Rhododendron Society.

George is an expert photographer as well as a birder who will share horticultural knowledge along the way. George knows the world of gardening including native plants, trees, bulbs, perennials, the uncommon, the unique and newest hybrids.



From I-395: go west on Rt. 236 about 2.75 miles to a light at Hillbrook. Turn left onto Hillbrook and then right into the parking lot of the library.
