

The fixed price plants will be available for purchase (cash, check or credit card) anytime during the event.

As a special feature, we are planning to auction off the naming rights of one or more azalea cultivars. So, if there is someone special in your life you would like to honor, this is a great opportunity.





There will be over 250 varieties available, including deciduous and evergreen azaleas, rhododendrons, and some other types of plants; surely something for everyone. Handouts will be distributed to all attendees and will include plant descriptions. We also plan to have the handout information available on our website (www.nv-asa.org) by the end of September.

This function is open to the public, so please invite your family, friends, and neighbors; anyone who might be interested in azaleas and gardening. Light refreshments will be provided.

Frances Lucille Louer

Frances Lucille Louer, age 88, passed away Monday, June 17, 2013. She is survived by her loving husband Phil as well as five children and their families, including Leslie and David Nanney. Frances was born in Marion, Ohio in 1924, the daughter of Clarence and Helen Hedge. She came to Washington in 1943 to work for the War Department. Frances began growing azaleas in the late 1960's. She joined the American Rhododendron Society a few years later and also completed the Master Gardeners course.

Frances was a founding member of the Northern Virginia chapter ASA in 1981 and became its first corresponding secretary. She and Phil produced the chapter newsletter for 30 years. In 1983 they moved to a new home on five acres in Haymarket, Virginia and began to assemble one of the largest privately held azalea collections in the country. It now has 9,200 plants of 3,500 different cultivars displayed in a beautifully designed woodland garden.

Frances was also a member of the Wildflower Society. Her garden grew to include many wildflower species, as well as large plantings of ferns, hosta, iris, daffodils and daylilies. Frances always welcomed visitors to the garden and hosted as many as 20 tours every spring for local plant societies, church groups and of course the ASA and ARS. She contributed many cuttings to the chapter's annual cutting exchange and was happy to welcome anyone to collect cuttings from her garden.

In 2009 the ASA awarded Frances and Phil the Distinguished Service Award for their longstanding contributions to the Northern Virginia Chapter and the National ASA.

Frances was a "master" gardener in every sense of the word. She will be missed by all her friends in the ASA.

Longtime ASA and Northern Virginia Chapter member Sybil Przypek passed away peacefully on July 25, 2013. Sybil was a native of North Carolina and a Yorktown, VA resident since 1976. Sybil made a big contribution for azalea lovers in York County. She had the vision to establish the York County Learning Garden and Arboretum. She made her vision a reality on Goodwin Neck Road where she planted and tended azaleas and rhododendrons—well over fifty varieties which were the first plants in the new garden. Plants were obtained from azalea and

rhododendron hybridizers, such as LeMac Nursery, and horticultural organization plant sales. Sybil watered the plants by bringing filled gallon milk jugs from home in the back of her car to the Learning Garden and Arboretum. The Garden's wonderful springtime show by the azaleas and rhododendrons are a continuing tribute to Sybil. In addition to the ASA, Sybil was also was an active member of the Colonial Virginia Chapter of American Holly Society, and a member of the MAC Chapter of the American Rhododendron Society where she was a former President, Vice President and also served in other official positions.

The Northern Virginia Chapter will hold its 6th annual azalea auction on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 12th</u> at the **Kirkwood Presbyterian Church**, 8336 Carrleigh Parkway in Springfield, Virginia. The activity will include a **Silent Auction** from 1 -2 PM and a **Live Auction** from 2-5 PM. Additional opportunities to purchase uncommon evergreen and deciduous azaleas will be between 1-5 PM in the **Fixed Price** offerings. These auctions are not only entertaining, but more importantly support the chapter's activities throughout the year. This event has proven to be a great opportunity to expand one's collection of the special, unique and beautiful azaleas. This year's auction has several new features that should make this an enjoyable and exciting event.

A wide variety of azaleas will be available with many hybrids developed by chapter members that are not found in the commercial markets and are developed for our local growing conditions. As part of the auction offerings, bidders will have the opportunity to **Purchase Naming Rights** for several new azalea species. Members will also be able to **pre-register** on the chapter website, reserve fixed price plants in advance, and **pay** for purchases with a **credit card**. This year, for the first time, we will be **accepting credit cards** for purchases. We have located a company that provides credit card charging services for a nominal 2.75% flat rate. We hope this will work out successfully and also enable us to do more business at sales such as Green Spring Gardens in the spring. Below is a brief summary of the changes you will see this year:

- **Pre-registration**. We are encouraging all members who plan to attend the auction to pre-register on our web site. We hope this will streamline the registration process and eliminate the bottlenecks seen in the past. Pre-registering can be done at any time.

--To pre-register you must have a login on the web site. If you do not yet have a login, please go to the web site and click on the **Register** button just below the logo on the left menu bar. You will be asked for your email address, phone number and zip code to validate your membership.

- After setting your login password, you will then need to login to the web site using the **Login** button just to the left of the Register button.

- Next, click on the **Plant Sales** link on the left menu bar. This will take you to the page which displays information about the auction and a **Member Only Information** section: (continued p.6)

- Starting September 25th the FIXED PRICE plants will be available for pre-ordering.
