Glenn Dale Azaleas

Barbara Bullock (curator of Rhododendrons and Azaleas at the National Arboretum) was introduced. She gave us the following history and the significance of Glenn Dale Azaleas.

Benjamin Morrison was a Landscape architect. He started his first crosses in 1929. His goal was to produce versions of southern Indian Azaleas which would be hardy in Washington D.C... The subspecies were oriental in origin. He did much more *as* his hybrids bloom early and later and additional flower color, statures and other useful attributes were added. 75,000 seedlings were grown and from survivors in the Washington D.C. climate 454 were named...

Marcus Jones (curator of Woody plants at Norfolk Botanical Gardens) was introduced. He was here to share the NBG goals. He listed the Glenn Dale Plants they currently have. He thanked us for our help.

Carolyn Beck handed out the voting papers with lists of favorite Glenn Dale Azaleas. Dan Krabill led the discussion as Don Hyatt showed slides of the Azaleas. It was a beautiful show and very hard to pick favorites.

After compiling votes from many sources, next stop will be to acquire the Azaleas through gifts and purchase for NBG.
