It is in the south side of Little River Turnpike at the intersection of Hillbrook Dr. to the south and Evergreen La. to the north— between the Capitol Beltway, I-495, and the Shirley Highway, I-395.

- From the Beltway I-495: go east on Route 236 about 1.70 miles to Hillbrook; the library is on the right at this corner.
- From Shirley Hwy. I-395: go west about 2.75 miles to Hillbrook. Turn left to the library on the corner.
