Chapter Members,

It's hard to believe that another year has passed. Once again the chapter had a very successful year with excellent programs, profitable plants sales and an active Legacy Project program, which is now an official project of the Azalea Society of America. The Executive Committee has proposed another interesting and ambitious schedule of events for 2018.

The chapter continued its efforts to expose the public to Legacy hybrids. On 2 November, Susan and I delivered 21 Stewart and Klimavicz azaleas to Aaron Cook at Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute in Hudson, NC. Aaron is a former President of the ASA and had contacted to chapter earlier in the year to acquire the plants in support of the Legacy Project.

On 17 November, the chapter provided 33 Glenn Dale azaleas to the Norfolk Botanical Garden (NBG) as part of the Legacy Project. The chapter previously conducted a Glenn Dale project with NBG, starting in 2011. This project identified the "best" Glenn Dales and helped NBG increase their inventories of the hybrid group. The project went into hiatus for a couple of years and has now been reinvigorated. This is the first of the deliveries of plants to NBG.

Seeking volunteers for One-Day Workday in the Azalea Collections -Saturday Dec 2, 2017

Dear Past, Present and Future Volunteers,

Tis the season of leaf drop, volumous, beautious, wonderous –in the Azalea Collections at the National Arboretum. This is our **7**th **Annual Saturday Fall Work Day** – every year, the first Saturday in December.

This email is being sent to you because either you have worked a weekend workday in the past, or have expressed interest. If I have sent this in error, I apologize, *please just ignore*. I can't seem to delete addresses from my government email list.

We all have lives at home and this is a busy time of the year. Remember I know: "Your Life Comes First" -- BUT if you have some "spare" time, please send me an email or give a call, and we'll work together to put the Azalea Collection to "bed" for the winter. Please also forward to any people you think might be interested in joining us. I'm sending to Garden Clubs, Master Gardeners, former voluteers, and volunteer coodinators. (*I do not have current contact addresses or emails for DC, VA, nor MD Master Gardeners – so if you do, could you please forward, or send me their contact info. Thank you!)

TASKS: We will be digging weeds (like Arum italicum and English Ivy); raking and tarping leaves, picking leaves out of azaleas; some pruning, some dividing of perennials. I will provide all tools needed for the day.

DATE: Saturday December 2nd, 2017 from 10:00a.m. to 3:00p.m. Please park in regular visitor's parking lot and meet a few minutes before 10am, in the lobby of the administration building. We will walk up together. If you have to come late, our receptionist will need your one-day form, provide you a name tag, and send up up. You will find us in the vicinity of the Lee Garden. Please fill out the One Day form, (attached) and bring it with you. We'll have extras at the front desk if you forget –but they need to be filled out BEFORE you work. Any regular USNA volunteers can sign in and out as usual.

QUALIFICATIONS: Simply the desire to work outside, and a love of gardening. Some moderate hill climbing ability required. Some previous gardening experience is helpful.

BRING: You should bring your own gardening gloves —but we have some if you forget; a lunch and plenty of water in a non-breakable container. We will take a break around 12:30pm and eat in somewhere off the beaten path in the garden. So, bring it up with you when you walk up into the garden. Wear closed-toed sturdy shoes; and dress in layers. Some people bring hats and kneeling pads.

BEFORE YOU LEAVE HOME: IF the weather is "iffy", too cold, damp, drizzly, this is a chance that I will cancel our work day. Please check in with our receptionist if you are in doubt. If I cancel, I will call her by 8:30am, from my home, on the morning of our work day to cancel. The ONLY WAY to find out if we're canceled is to call (202) 245-4523 after 8:30a.m. If the weather is nice, you don't need to call. It takes a pretty bad day for me to cancel. I will not cancel if it is cold. Unfortunatly, there will be no rescheduled date.

Now, let's hope the leaves fall on schedule. We're finally starting to feel like fall around here. Happy Halloween everyone, and I look forward to seeing all of you again!!
