Chapter Members,

My late winter plants are starting to bloom so I know that spring is not far behind. **George McLellan** gave a talk to our chapter on the "**Garden in Winter**" in 2014. **Susan** and I used the list he provided to go plant shopping. Now we have hellebores, camellias and Japanese apricot - "**Bonita**" in bloom.

Spring time is prime time for azaleas and our chapter activities. Some of these events are scheduled based on expected bloom times and will be updated as this information becomes available. I've often spoken about the **Legacy Project**. The **Northern Virginia Chapter** is very active in promoting the goals of the project. **Barb Kirkwood** has just about completed negotiations to establish a Memorandum of Understanding for the establishment of a **Klimavicz Legacy Garden** at **Meadowlark Gardens** in Vienna. The next step will be starting the design and eventual planting of the **Klimavicz** cultivars.

We recently became aware of the Vineland azalea hybrids which were developed by Horticultural Research Institute of Ontario (HRIO) in Vineland Ontario. Chapter member Nick Yarmoshuk from St. Catharines, Chair of the American Rhododendron Society, Test & Display Garden Committee, has been working with the Niagara Chapter of the Rhododendron Society of Canada to preserve the legacy of the Vineland hybrids. He has agreed to be the legacy lead for the Vineland hybrids.
