Members brought a large variety of dishes to share and after a delicious lunch, Barb Kirkwood opened the meeting welcomed all of the attendees. She provided information on our successful plant sales in May as well as discussing upcoming chapter events. **Barbara Bullock**, from the National Arboretum, had been invited to the meeting. Carolyn Beck, on behalf of Bob Stewart, presented **Barbara** with a copy of the newly named "Barbara Bullock," azalea (formerly RBS-85). **Barbara** has been involved with the azalea community for many years, not only with her work at the arboretum, but also as an author of articles for *The* **Azalean** as well as a speaker for our chapter and others over the years.

**Lars Larson** took the reins of the actual cutting exchange, directing who and how many bags of cuttings each attendee could select each round. Additionally, a large number of plants (azaleas and other) were available for selection.

**Barry Sperling** presented an interesting and informative talk on using the "Creel" method of propagating azaleas. He cited a high success rate using this method. It looks promising and I am going to try it out with some of my cuttings this year.

**Carolyn Beck** later gave an excellent workshop on another method of rooting cuttings using rooting medium and placing cuttings in plastic bags exposed to indirect sunlight (or under plant lights). A large number of attendees joined in the hands-on workshop. There were several great questions posed and I think all of us walked away with a greater knowledge on this method, as well as two pots of rooting cuttings.

On our way home to Yorktown, **Susan** and I stopped to see **David** and **Patsy Meadows** in Opal, VA. **David** had announced at the meeting that he had a large number of hellebore varieties for sale. We love hellebores. They make great companion plants for azaleas, are deer resistant and add winter interest to the garden. We picked up a large number for very reasonable prices.
