Meeting with Speaker on "Stewart Azaleas" and Plant Exchange - 6 October 1:30-4:00 pm Kirkwood Presbyterian Church

The next chapter meeting will be held on 6 October at Kirkwood Presbyterian Church.

Rick Bauer will be giving a presentation on **Bob Stewart's** azaleas with a focus on the newly named varieties.

Officers for 2025

Year End Charitable Contributions

The chapter generates revenue each year, primarily through our plant sales. Part of the revenue generated is used to support chapter activities. Historically, a sizable portion of this revenue has been used to support other, primarily horticultural, organizations as well as the national society.

The amount of money available for donations is determined by the executive committee based on the chapter's end of year financial situation. In addition to the total amount available, the executive committee makes recommendations for organizations to receive

the donations as well as the amount. These recommendations are voted on by the general membership at the annual meeting.

We realize there may be other 501 (c) (3) organizations deserving of consideration for donations. In the past, these organizations have been identified at the annual meeting, without sufficient time for vetting. To preclude this occurring again, chapter members may submit their recommendations to the executive committee as well as justification for the donation (i.e., background on what the organization does and why they should be considered) to Paul Beck 703-209-2219 or pabeck@gmail.com prior to 1 November. Preparing Plants for the Plant Exchange

The plant exchanges provide an excellent venue for parting with your excess plants and for adding additional varieties to your collection. Plants should be watered before donating, though not overly wet (i.e., no dripping of water from the container). Please label them with the name of the plant and the donor (the latter is in case someone has questions about the plant).
