2025 ASA National Convention – Brandywine Valley, PA 7-9 May 2025

It's time to make your reservations for the upcoming society convention in Malvern, PA. Our friends at Jenkins Arboretum in Deven, PA graciously offered to sponsor this convention.

For the information of new members, we have had a great relationship with Jenkins over the past few years and have collaborated closely with them to establish a Holly Springs Legacy Garden and also to increase their inventory of Satsuki azaleas.

The co-chairs of the convention, **Steve**

Wright and **Tara Spears** are also members of the Northern Virginia Chapter.

The dates for the convention are May 7-9. Put it on your calendar. **Registrations must** be made by April 8th, after which time a \$50 fee will be applied. A full refund is available only for cancellations made before March 8, 2025.

The convention will be held at The Desmond Hotel in Malvern. Parking is free and a full hot breakfast is included with your reservation. 80 rooms have been reserved with a special convention rate of \$169 per night Wednesday night through Friday night. 20 rooms have been held at the convention rate for both Tuesday night and Saturday night for those wishing to extend their stay. **Rooms must be reserved by April 8th to receive that rate**. Reservations made after that date will be subject to room availability and higher pricing.

Nuccio's Nursery Fire

All of us are aware of the devastating fires in Southern California. The Eaton fire destroyed substantial portions of the city of Altadena, CA. Nuccio's azalea and camellia nursery is in Altadena. **Dave Nanney** has spoken to **Jim Nuccio** who reported that all their buildings and equipment were destroyed in the fire. Miraculously, most of their inventory of azaleas and camellias was relatively unscathed. With the dry weather and the lack of water, their survival

was also in danger. Fortunately, a local water service, Water Truck Service Ramos, provided a truck load of water for the plants at no charge. This was just a start. Normal water sources remain unavailable. No rain has occurred, and the plants remain at risk. This may only hasten what was to be their last year before the sale of the 90-year-old nursery.

Tom Nuccio is currently hospitalized for an unrelated non-life-threatening illness.

Maria Haas has provided more links on the nursery. A GoFundMe page HAD been instituted for them. They were very appreciative but weren't comfortable accepting the donations and asked that the page be

taken down. **Kathy Liu**, a local member of the Camellia Society, is trying to facilitate access to the nursery and will help organize a cleanup and sale of the plants when access is allowable. I will pass on the information when received.
