Significant 2025 Items

The most significant item from 2025 was the unexpectedly large revenue from the convention hosted by Jenkins Arboretum & Gardens. All of the plant sales were under budget, and in the case of Meadowlark, significantly under budget. Even though the weather was great, the turnout was much below prior years. Note also that we did not have a Bonsai sale due to scheduling conflicts. Net plant sale revenue was \$\$11,488.50, or 104% of the \$11,000 budget. The **Member-Only** sale this year was ad hoc, and was not very successful, yielding only \$583. Meadowlark plant sales were worse than expected; however, Meadowlark is still a highly successful venue. We collected \$68.71 in credit card fees against \$63.95 charged by PayPal.
